PDCA SCHEDULES DICEP CONFERENCE WITH DATE CHANGE

The PDCA of the Gulf Coast chapter and PDCA (national) have scheduled the 2008 Design and Installation of Cost-Efficient Pile (DICEP) conference in New Orleans, LA.

The one-day conference will be held on FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 12, 2008, not Thursday, September 25 as originally scheduled. The conference had to be changed due to a conflict with another conference schedule around the same time.

The DICEP conference will feature 6 presentations primarily designed for civil, geotechnical, and structural engineers, presenting the lectures from an engineering perspective on the advantages of driven pile. However, the conference is also intended to provide a positive learning experience for contractors and other firms or individuals who support, conduct business or are associated with the pile driving industry.

This year, the PDCA of the Gulf Coast Chapter and the PDCA Education Committee have planned lectures on topics which include "Cost Components of Driven Pile Foundations", a presentation on the "Rigolets Bridge Project and US Hwy 90 in New Orleans" using 66" cylinder pile, an "Overview of New Technologies in Driven Pile", "Driven Pile Set Up Prediction Using Dynamic Tests", an overview of the "PDCA Installation Specifications for Driven Pile", and "Value Engineered Changes to Driven Piles Provides Benefits to Owners" – a multi-project comparison of real costs between auger cast (CFA) and driven pile. The local chapter members have been successful in converting several CFA projects to driven pile in the Gulf Coast area. The idea behind this presentation is to contrast the real cost of finished CFA projects to those that have been converted to driven pile.

Subash Kulkarni, Kulkarni Consultants, APC will provide the keynote presentation on ethics, titled, "Can an Engineering Firm Conduct Business and Still Be Ethical?"

The conference will provide 7 PDH's towards the State of Louisiana Professional Engineering and Land Surveying Board requirements for engineering license renewal. PDH's will include the required one-hour course on "Ethics".

The PDCA will also provide members with the opportunity to exhibit during the conference. PDCA has arranged to have 19 6' table tops available for exhibitors. The DICEP conference will provide a great opportunity for suppliers and manufacturers to spend some quality time with up to 120 engineers and contractors in a focused setting. The exhibit area is adjacent to the

meeting rooms and will be the location of the continental breakfast and the AM and PM breaks. Additional time to network will be provided following the luncheon.

The Pile Driving Contractors Association (PDCA), the Geo-Institute of ASCE and ADSC The International Association of Foundation Drilling and will join together to present the largest Geotechnical Engineering and Geo-Construction Congress ever held – the International

Foundation Congress and Equipment Expo '09 (IFCEE '09). This Congress will focus on foundations and will include related geo-engineering and geo-construction technologies including foundation engineering, ground modification and earth retention. The IFCEE '09 provides a premier setting as well as providing a vital element in helping you meet your marketing goals!

The IFCEE '09 will be held in Orlando, Florida at the Lake Buena Vista Palace Resort from March 15 - 19, 2009. Goble Consulting Engineer), Wayne Waters (Ed Waters and Sons Contracting Co., Inc.) and Pat Hannigan (GRL, Inc.). The discussion will include comparisons of the PDCA Installation Specifications for Driven Pile (PDCA Specification 103-07) and that of AASHTO and IBC in the areas of Payment, Driving Equipment, Materials, Capacity Verification and Installation Issues.

The IFCEE '09 has also selected several PDCA presentations and short courses.

PDCA TO PARTICIPATE IN DEVELOPMENT OF "SOILS REPORT"

During the recent GeoCoalition meeting in Denver, CO, the coalition members agreed to collaboratively work on the development of a "Soils Report" and what would be considered reasonable information for such a report to contain.


The discussion concluded with the coalition agreeing to establish a Task Force that will produce a "Soils Report", which contains reasonable language regarding "responsibilities and content". The Task Force will be comprised of representatives from the Geo-Institute of ASCE, PDCA, ADSC, DFI, AEG and ASFE.

PDCA Board members, Don Dolly, (Foundation Constructors, Inc.) and Dave Chapman (Blakeslee, Arpaia, Chapman) have agreed to represent the PDCA on this important Task Force. Mr. Alan MacNab (Condon-Johnson) will Chair the Task Force.

The Task Force's objective will be to define the scope of a "Soils Report" by reviewing background information and resources and generating "guidelines" for soils reporting. The report will primarily be written to allow the Geotechnical engineers to present the report to owners or a very focused audience, encouraging them to use the report.

PDCA of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter - The PDCA of the Mid-Atlantic Chapter recently held their quarter dinner meeting on Thursday, June 26, 2008, at Paul's on the South River, Riva, MD. The chapter dinner did not feature a presentation by a specific speaker, but was conducted as a chapter business meeting. During the meeting, President Irv Ragsdale (Clark Foundations, LLC) updated the members and guests on the success of the recent dinner meeting with speaker Jerry DiMaggio, FHWA. Rob Braden (Skyline Steel), Treasurer provided a financial report indicating the status of the chapter was doing well as a result of the last DICEP conference and dinner meetings. Steve Hall, PDCA Executive Director updated the members on national activities. Irv Ragsdale then opened the floor for nominations for the position of chapter Vice President. William "Bill" Bonneau, Senior Project Manager, Cianbro, Baltimore, MD was nominated and voted unanimously as the chapter's Vice President. Congratulations, Bill.

Additional discussions were held in a roundtable format and included local business and industry work, the economy, and local communities/Cities/Towns, etc that were beginning to enact moratoriums on driven pile work due to noise and vibration. Steve Hall indicated that PDCA is concluding its Noise and Vibration Database that will provide credible arguments against the perceived noise and vibration resulting from driving piles. Steve Hall also indicated that PDCA has grown to the point that taking on legislative issues at their point of origin is no longer out of the realm of possibilities of our resources and expertise. PDCA can write a white paper on noise and vibration, dispelling longstanding myths and providing factual evidence that these two issues are not the problems once believed to be. PDCA can also participate in committees that are generating legislation or at the very minimum be asked to sit on review committees to rebut the ordinance language and challenge the legitimacy of the proposal.

Finally, the PDCA discussed a plant tour for engineers at the Atlantic Metro Cast, Inc. concrete production plant in LaPlata, MD. The plant produces pre-stressed, precast concrete piles and has offered to do a plant tour for local engineers. The purpose is to expose engineers to the quality control, quality assurances and exacting standards that are incorporated into the manufacturing of driven pile – in this case, concrete. This program has been successfully conducted with positive outcomes by PDCA independent contractor, Signor Enterprises (Rusty Signor) in

Austin, TX and by the PDCA of South Carolina Chapter, who also incorporated timber and steel pile manufacturing into their program.

PDCA of California - PDCA is expecting to begin conversations with the PDCA of California Chapter regarding the collaborative efforts of holding the 2009 DICEP in the San Francisco area. PDCA is moving DICEP around to all chapters on a rotating basis and is looking forward to working with the California chapter to host this program in 2009.

Alan excelled in the area of planning, design, project management, and construction of marine, port and land structures in arctic and sub-arctic regions. Alan considered his most notable achievement to be the development of specialized driven pile foundations for arctic and sub-arctic conditions.
