CONTINUING EDUCATION FOR ARCHITECTS, ENGINEERS, AND LAND SURVEYORS

Continuing Education will now be required for all registered architect, engineers and land surveyors who are licensed in the state of Virginia. The Virginia General Assembly passed a bill during the 2006 legislative session which mandated the Board of Architects, Professional Engineer and Land Surveyors, Certified Interior Designers, and Landscape Architects (APELSCIDLA Board) implement a mandatory continuing education program (16 hours of continuing education activities) for architects, **professional engineers**, and land surveyors (HB 1054). The law became effective on July 1, 2006, and the Board initiated the process to promulgate the necessary regulations for the program on September 7, 2006. The new regulations became effective April. 1, 2009; there is a one year delayed enactment clause. PDCA has been told that all professional engineers who renew their license after March 2010 will be required to have completed the 16 hour requirement.

PDCA is planning on conducting an educational program in Virginia in early 2010 in an effort to help Virginia state licensed engineers met this new requirement. The PDCA program will meet the criteria established by the law for continuing educational units.

PDCA of South Carolina: On July 10, 2009, PDCA of SC hosted a group of 10 students from the University of North Carolina, Charlotte. Their Professor, Dr. Brian Anderson, had attended the PDCA Professors' Driven Pile Institute at Utah State. During that time, Dr. Anderson spoke with PDCA President John King (Pile Drivers, Inc. – Hollywood, (Charleston area), SC) regarding a field trip to Charleston, so his graduate and undergraduate engineering students could become more familiar with driven piles through the manufacturing and pile driving processes.

The field trip began at 9:00 AM on July 10. Dr. Anderson and his students began the trip at Palmetto Piledriving for a tour of their prestressed concrete plant. The tour was conducted by Scott Nigels. Then Greg Canivan (S&ME, Charleston) made arrangements for a Cone Penetrometer Testing (CPT) Unit and a Pile Driving Analyzer (PDA) to be set up onsite for demonstrations. The technicians demonstrated the use of both the CPT and PDA, giving the students some insight into the geotechnical side of testing driven piles. The class then moved to a Pile Drivers, Inc. jobsite to witness the installation of 12"x 75' prestressed concrete piles. Michael McCormick (Pile Drivers Inc.) gave a tour of the jobsite and answered questions regarding the project and driving operations.

PDCA of South Carolina treated the group to lunch after the demonstrations. The students left Charleston with a greater understanding of the quality control and quality assurance that goes into pile manufacturing and pile driving through strict manufacturing standards and testing; along with a greater understanding of deep foundations with which to approach their profession upon graduation. PDCA of South Carolina has another student visit planned for the fall and is intending upon making this tour a regular event.




MEMBERS ON THE MOVE
