

This is the formal application required for entry into the 2024 PDCA Project of the Year Awards program, please read it carefully. All entries received will include this form.

The Project of the Year awards are open to all PDCA members. A non-member may submit one application for an international project.

Entries are to be received in the PDCA office no later than Friday, April 5, 2024.

Winning entries will be recognized in PileDriver magazine and will be awarded at a PDCA Annual Conference. All entries may earn coverage in an issue of PileDriver magazine. Understanding that projects may be covered in PileDriver magazine, project narratives should be provided in a format appropriate for print.

GENERAL REQUIREMENTS

- 1. The Project of the Year competition is open to all PDCA member projects completed before December 31, 2023. The driven pile portion of the project must be completed by this time to be accepted. The project can be from any date prior to the above completion date and can be a previously submitted non-winning Project of the Year entry.
- 2. Entries must be submitted with permission of principals of the company and the project owner.
- 3. Judging is based on a complete entry form addressing criteria outlined in the application.
- 4. One entry form should be completed for each project submitted. While there is no limit to the number of projects that a PDCA member can submit for consideration, each project shall be submitted for only one category.
- 5. Entry categories include:
 - a. Land A Land project is considered to be a job located on land or accessed by land.
 - b. Marine A Marine project is considered to be a job that is accessed by boat or barge.
 - c. Earth Retention



- d. Associate / Engineering Affiliate
- e. International
- 6. The entry fee is FREE for all PDCA members.

HOW TO SUBMIT FINAL PRESENTATION

- All entries must be submitted via electronic file share. If necessary, PDCA will provide a shared DropBox folder for your convenience. Please contact Matt Bisbee (matt@piledrivers.org) for assistance.
- 2. The written project narrative must be in a Microsoft Word document format. Please consider writing the narrative with the perspective that it could be used for a PileDriver magazine article, providing as much detail as possible in your response.
- 3. Please do not submit a PDF of the project narrative.
- 4. Please do not embed photos in the text summaries of the Word document.
- 5. Additional supporting documentation may be submitted including letters of recommendation, a list of accolades, media coverage, etc.

PROJECT NARRATIVE

Please answer as many of the following questions that apply to this project in as much detail as possible. You may provide any additional information that you deem relevant.

- 1. What was the pile driving aspect of the project within the scope of the entire project? Please provide some basic information about the completed structure.
- 2. What was the pile type?
- 3. What was the production pile count for each pile type used?
- 4. What equipment was used and who were the supplier companies?
- 5. In what ways were the driven piles the best design solution to meet the needs of the project owner and why were driven piles best suited to the site geotechnical conditions?



- 6. In what ways was the project challenging? What were the creative solutions?
- 7. Did the driven pile scope of work require any kind of special innovation in terms of construction techniques, equipment, or materials used? Please provide a detailed description.
- 8. Were cost saving measures implemented? Please provide a detailed description.
- 9. Were there any changes from other deep foundation or earth retention system to driven piles?
- 10. What environmental requirements, considerations, or conditions were present on the site? How were these mitigated?
- 11. Why do you believe this project qualifies to receive a PDCA Project of the Year Award?

Photos can highlight the progression of the construction process, including the completed structure. Please provide accurate descriptions and captions for each photo, as well as photo credits.
